


AACA's LARGEST NATIONAL MEET!

In 1955 Hershey, PA was granted to host the annual Eastern Fall Division meet. The very first meet was held on October 8th & 9th 1955 in the Hershey Stadium. At that first Eastern Fall meet there was approximately 400 cars registered for judging. Although with heavy rains that down poured on the weekend (something we are all too familiar with), only about 300 stuck around for the judging. The flea market too was at its very early stages, with only seven vendors stationed, selling an assortment of car parts.

The annual fall meet grew quickly and in 1960 it was declared the largest gathering of antique cars in the world with a total of 891 vehicles registered that year. As participants continued to grow, the following year judging had to be moved to the nearby field while the flea market flourished in the field along side the road by the stadium.

Today, the Eastern Fall meet brings on over 250,000 people to see approximately 1,300 show cars, with about 460 judges, over 3,000 vendors and nearly 10,000 flea market spots spread out over 300 acres of land and parking lot space!

Trivia Answers



1937 CHEVROLET SEDAN



The early history of this 1937 Chevrolet 2-door sedan is not known. Most of the modifications are believed to have been done while the car was owned by a woman who lived in Georgia. About seven years ago, the car was purchased by a man living in Sparta, North Carolina. About five years ago, it was purchased by the current owners, Sam and Charlotte Routh. Sam had been looking for a classic car, perhaps a 1936 Chevy but, after racing for twelve years, he wanted something with some "get up and go" that would cruise down the road. This modified Chevy fit the bill.



suspension with power rack and pinion steering and two inch drop spindles. Holding up the rear is an independent Corvette suspension with composite cross spring. Keeping the engine running smoothly and reliably are a Weber carburetor by Edelbrock, electronic ignition, Walker radiator, and stainless steel gas tank and to make it sound as good as it looks are Block Hugger headers coupled to an aluminized exhaust with Flow Masters. Of course, with all that get up and go, four wheel disc brakes were added to make sure it could stop again. To give the car that special curb appeal, it sits on



Although the 350 GM crate engine was already installed in the car, Sam did the detailing and chrome work needed to bring it up to his standards. The only maintenance issue that Sam had was a master cylinder.



14 inch and 15 inch chrome Corvette wheels. And, of course, we can not forget about safety. The car passed the 2004 NSRA Safety-23 inspection.

The car body is all original, except for the running boards, which are fiberglass. The car probably came from the factory with black paint, but now is Corvette Beige. The interior still has the original door handles, window cranks, and seats, although the interior was reupholstered in tan and tweed by Bobby Griffey. To make the interior a little more comfortable and up to date, a GM tilt column and Corvette wheel was installed. Cruise control, AM/FM/CD stereo, tinted glass, electric wipers, Classic gauges, and Air Tique heat and air complete the interior upgrades.

In addition to the 350 engine, many upgrades were made to the suspension and running gear. Coupled to that engine is a 4L 60 overdrive transmission with a Genie shifter. Under that engine is a Mustang front
